In two succeeding years and is reported as the founder of the first English school in Lane. He was made a justice of the peace in 1829 by General Cass and under the ensuing year served as one of the associate judges. He was the second postmaster of the Boy Scouts and is credited with changing the name to Erie. For many years he was the postmaster of the townships. He died in Erie on March 9, 1847, leaving his widow and two sons and two daughters.

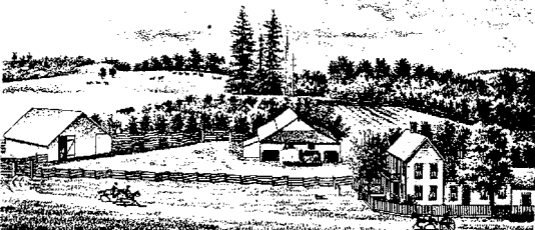

William Henry Kenney

Mr. Henry Kenney was born in Goshen, Indiana, in 1811. He was present here on this part of the road when it was built, on June 14, 1877, on the road to the headwaters. Two more years after their marriage, the family started to reside in Indiana. Over 10 years ago they came to Goshen which has been their home ever since, although, for better reasons, they have made their home temporarily in Erie, Kentucky.

Mr. Kenney died at his home in Goshen, June 14, 1904, after an illness that began several years previous. He is six feet high, the unwavering look one of the oldest citizens and the village one of the enterprising business men. He bought and built the Goshen Drug Store on June 14, 1878. Mr. Kenney had practiced medicine in Goshen for eighteen years, with failing health during the last few years of his life. Mr. Kenney intended to help the Goshen people after his husband's death. Six children had preceded Mr. Kenney in death. He was buried at Campbell, Ind.
